Scripture: Psalm 50:14, Psalm 51:17, Psalm 69:30

Description

Clement of Rome emphasizes the importance of confession and praise to the Lord, stating that God desires our acknowledgment and gratitude more than material offerings. He quotes the psalmist David, highlighting the value of a contrite spirit and the power of calling upon God in times of trouble for deliverance and glorification.

Transcript

The Lord, brethren, stands in need of nothing; and He desires nothing of any one, except that confession be made to Him. For, says the elect David, "I will confess to the Lord; and that will please Him more than a young bullock that has horns and hoofs. Let the poor see it, and be glad."

And again he says, "Offer to God the sacrifice of praise, and pay your vows to the Most High. And call upon Me in the day of your trouble: I will deliver you, and you shall glorify Me." For "the sacrifice of God is a broken spirit."
