Description

St. Benedict of Nursia emphasizes the importance of seeking true and everlasting life by keeping our speech pure and turning away from evil, while actively pursuing peace. He reminds us that God's eyes are on those who follow His ways, and He is attentive to their prayers even before they call upon Him. St. Benedict highlights the sweetness of the Lord's invitation to walk in His ways and experience His loving kindness, which leads to the path of life.

And the Lord, seeking his laborer
in the multitude to whom He thus cries out,
says again,
"Who is the one who will have life,
and desires to see good days" (Ps. 33[34]:13)?
And if, hearing Him, you answer,
"I am the one,"
God says to you,
"If you will have true and everlasting life,
keep your tongue from evil
and your lips that they speak no guile.
Turn away from evil and do good;

seek after peace and pursue it" (Ps. 33[34]:14-15).

And when you have done these things,

My eyes shall be upon you

and My ears open to your prayers;

and before you call upon Me,

I will say to you,

'Behold, here I am'" (Ps. 33[34]:16; Is. 65:24; 58:9).
